Hunt Lane, Oldham

Background

Traffic signal control of an existing crossroads on the A663 trunk road, together with widening of the carriageway on three approaches, were required to cope with an increase in traffic loading resulting from an adjacent residential development in Oldham, Greater Manchester. Cole Easdon Consultants (CEC) used their expertise to ensure that this infrastructure project was completed on time and to budget.

The works cost, including utility diversions, was around £1 million.

Widening of the carriageway also required diversion and protection measures to major utility routes along the A663 corridor, a corridor that links the M60 and A627(M) motorways.
